SÜREKLİ EĞİTİM MERKEZ

Ege University, in line with the "No Poverty" goal set by the United Nations General Assembly within the framework of the Sustainable Development Goals, continued to strengthen its efforts in 2024 to support equal access of poor and vulnerable groups to economic resources and basic services.



In this context, Ege University carried out various activities in the fields of education, health, and social support with the aim of enhancing social welfare and ensuring equal opportunities. Financial and in-kind scholarship opportunities provided to low-income students, part-time employment opportunities created for students in need, free health services offered to students, free educational and awareness-raising activities for different segments of society, and social responsibility projects contributing to poverty reduction stand out among these activities.

Ege University aims to further enhance its social, economic, and humanitarian contributions toward ending all forms of poverty, in alignment with the globally adopted Sustainable Development Goals to be achieved by 2030.

SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

Scholarships For Students In Need Of Financial Support

Ege University offers various scholarship and loan opportunities in cooperation with several institutions, foundations, associations, and companies to support access to higher education for successful undergraduate and graduate students in need of financial assistance. In this context, scholarship and support programs provided by the Higher Education Loans and Dormitories Institution, the Ege University Empowerment Foundation, the Ege University Alumni Association, and several faculties of the university (Medicine, Dentistry, Pharmacy, Fisheries, and Agriculture) stand out for enabling students to continue their education without financial barriers.



In the 2023–2024 academic year, total of **54,807** students were enrolled at Ege University. Among them, **944** students received scholarships from private associations and foundations, **9,104** students received scholarships from the Higher Education Loans and Dormitories Institution, and **10,963** students benefited from its loan program - **providing financial support to a total of 21,011 students.**

The scholarships and loan opportunities provided represent a significant contribution of the university toward supporting students who experience educational inequality due to financial constraints and strengthening an inclusive and equitable learning environment.

Scientific Research Scholarships

Ege University is among the leading institutions fostering a research-oriented culture through scholarship and support programs provided by TÜBİTAK and the Scientific Research Projects (BAP) Coordination Unit for undergraduate, graduate, and doctoral students. In 2024, a total of 809 Ege University students benefited from these research scholarships, gaining the opportunity to support and advance their scientific studies.

Health Service

Students can apply to the EÜ Faculty of Medicine Campus Clinic and the EÜ Faculty of Dentistry Clinic within the campus with their Turkish ID number if they encounter any health issues. Students who do not have any social security coverage (who are not covered by their parents' insurance and are over 25 years of age) can apply to the Directorate of Health, Culture, and Sports to obtain a health card. Diagnosis and treatment costs for students without social security coverage are covered by Ege University.

A total of 9,405 people, mostly students, received outpatient services, and 382 students were vaccinated.

Ege University supports the psychological well-being of its students by offering individual counseling sessions and group therapy through its Psychological Counseling and Guidance Unit.

Psychological counseling services are provided free of charge by appointment.

LEARNING PROGRAM SUPPORT

Ege University is one of the most active universities in Turkey in terms of student and faculty exchange,



particularly within the Erasmus+ program, which is the most active of the European Union's Education and Youth Programs. Ege University is also an active participant in the "Farabi, Mevlana, and Orhun Exchange Programs," which offer exchange programs and bilateral agreements for student and faculty members to benefit from.

During the 2023-2024 academic year, a total of 358 students went abroad through international exchange programs and bilateral agreements, including 284 through Erasmus+ Student Mobility, 36 through Erasmus+ Trainee Mobility, 11 through the Orhun Program, 13 through the IAESTE Program, and 14 through Bilateral Cooperation Protocols. A total of 282

students came abroad through international exchange programs and bilateral agreements, including 108 through Erasmus+ Student Mobility (Study and Internship), 58 through the Orhun Program, 7 through the IAESTE Internship Program, and 109 through Bilateral Cooperation Protocols.

EQUAL ACCESS TO BASIC SERVICES: SOCIAL FACILITIES OPEN TO ALL

Ege University operates numerous Social Purpose Facilities to serve its members (employees, retirees, students), public officials, and other individuals from outside the public sector. These facilities offer services at rates that are considerably more economical than those found in the market.

Located directly on the beach, the facility offers guests seeking a peaceful vacation not only daily use but also half-board accommodation in bungalow-style cabins. For a 6-day period in 2024, accommodation is offered at a cost of 9,000 TL for E.Ü. staff and their first-degree relatives, and 4,500 TL for E.Ü. students..



Özdere Education and Recreation Facilities provided services between June 17 and September 15, 2024, offering half-board accommodation to 1,390 people throughout the season in 38 bungalow-style rooms, each accommodating four people. Day services were also provided to 1,447 people.

In 2024, 139 children received childcare and preschool education services at the kindergarten.

The museum have a very reasonable admission fee policy: free for soldiers, police officers, families of martyrs and veterans, people with disabilities, and those over 65; 10 TL for Ege University students, staff, and alumni; 15 TL for other students; and 25 TL for non-students.





Open to visitors throughout the year, Ege University
Ethnography Museum has also organized a rich program of events during the December 2024 period. These events, held in various fields ranging from archaeology to music performances, art exhibitions to cultural presentations, featured expert speakers.

COMMUNITY-ORIENTED EDUCATION AND INFORMATION ACTIVITIES

Ege University Continuing Education Center (EGESEM) offers quality educational opportunities for university students, public and private sector employees, young people outside the university, housewives, and individuals of all ages. The Center develops, implements, and coordinates unique and high-quality educational programs designed to contribute to the personal and professional development of participants, addressing every need.

EGESEM offers face-to-face and synchronous distance learning courses, as well as asynchronous courses integrated into Ege University's own infrastructure. Asynchronous courses can be accessed continuously via Ege University Academy TV without any time restrictions. An E-Certificate system that can be gueried via E-Government is in place. In 2024, 159 different training courses were offered at EGESEM, and 30,358 people were awarded certificates. EGESEM training courses in 2024 included ARIM PROGRAMLARI EĞİTİMİ Professional Development Training, Healthy Living Training, Sports

Training, Foreign Language Training, Personal Development Training, and Skills Training.

The project "Pilot Study on Beekeeping Training and Employment for Patients at the Community Mental Health Center," conducted under the leadership of Prof. Dr. Ayşegül Dönmez, Dean of the Faculty of Nursing at Ege University, and supported by TÜBİTAK, has been completed as an exemplary application aimed

at supporting social participation and employment. Within the scope of the project, theoretical and practical beekeeping training was provided to individuals registered at Ege University Community Mental Health Center, coordinated by Ege University Continuing Education Center (EGESEM) and conducted at

> the Faculty of Agriculture apiary. Participants who successfully completed the training were awarded certificates.



"Ege 3rd Age University" social responsibility project, launched by the Department of Internal Medicine at Ege University (EÜ) Faculty of Medicine, Department of Internal Medicine, as a first in Turkey

with a lifelong learning mission, has commenced the 2023-2024 Academic Year.

• Ege University EBİLTEM-TTO and Ege Technopark provide services to all individuals and entrepreneurs, regardless of their affiliation with the university, without any quotas or priority applications. According to the 2024 EBİLTEM Pre-Incubation Program performance data, while the

TÜBİTAK success rate was 38% in the "Number of Startups Incorporated" metric, the collaboration be"tween EBİLTEM and Ege Teknopark achieved a success rate of 43%, demonstrating above-average performance.

SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY PROJECTS

The Ege University Social Responsibility Projects Coordination Office strengthens social and civic responsibility awareness by encouraging university staff and students to contribute to solving social problems. Under the supervision of the Coordination Office, **1,3411 social responsibility projects** were carried out in 2024, each lasting at least two months and within a specific budget.

• The Ege University Observatory Application and Research Center, where 19 social responsibility projects continued in 2024, welcomed 35,000 visitors and provided regular educational programs. In addition, 28,000 students who did not have the opportunity to visit the Observatory were reached, enabling them to see a telescope for the first time and observe space.

In 2024, the **Ege University Rectorate Botanical Garden and Herbarium Application and Research Center** provided guided tours and educational services to 6,500 visitors from kindergartens, elementary schools, middle schools, high schools, universities, and special education institutions. Schools that registered for a tour at the Botanical Garden and Herbarium Center were able to visit these centers free of charge.

• Ege University Natural History Museum aims to raise a wareness of natural history through its rich collections; it organizes educational and awareness activities for students and visitors.





Associate Professor Dr. Pelin Piştav Akmeşe, Faculty Member at Ege University Faculty of Health Sciences and Coordinator of Engelsiz Ege Unit, has published a book titled "My Colors and Letters" to raise awareness about cerebral palsy. Proceeds from the book will be donated to provide special education and physical therapy services for children affected by the February 6 earthquake.





Ege University (EÜ) Ödemiş Faculty of Health Sciences, in collaboration with Bekir Girgin Kindergarten and Özel Beyaz Altay Daycare Center, organized the "Egeli Minikler Children's Festival." Held outdoors, this event allowed children to spend time immersed in nature, gaining environmental awareness while enjoying fun and educational activities. During the event, the young participants were treated to ice cream, plain cotton candy, corn on the cob, and pastries.





In collaboration with Ege University Faculty of Dentistry and Student Dean's Office, oral and dental health screenings were conducted for Ege University students at the Research-Focused Student Center (AROM) as part of 'Oral and Dental Health Week'.





Ege University students have supported families in need as part of a project carried out in collaboration with the İzmirtumed Association, based on their understanding of social responsibility. The students volunteered to prepare food packages obtained from various supermarkets and deliver them to families, thereby contributing to meeting their basic needs.
